CONSTITUTION
OF
BETA ALPHA PSI
PETITION CHAPTER #226
KENNESAW STATE UNIVERSITY

ARTICLE I. IDENTIFICATION

This honor society, a national scholastic and professional Accounting, Finance, and Information systems fraternity, shall be known as Petitioning Chapter 226 of Beta Alpha Psi, Kennesaw State University.

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this fraternity shall be to encourage and to recognize scholastic and professional excellence in the fields of accounting, finance, and information systems.

ARTICLE III. INSIGNIA

The seal shall be circular in form with the legend "Seal of Beta Alpha Psi" encircling a reproduction of the insignia and the year "1919".

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERS

SECTION 1. The members of this Chapter shall be limited to those persons who have achieved scholastic excellence in the fields of accounting, finance, and information systems.

SECTION 2. The members of this Chapter shall be those persons who have been initiated according to the official ritual, have paid required fees, and are in good standing.

SECTION 3. Membership shall be open to all persons regardless of race, creed, color, sex, religion, disability, or national origin.

SECTION 4. The members shall be known by a certificate of membership, authenticated by official signatures and the seal of the fraternity, that shall be issued to each student, faculty, and honorary initiate upon payment of the initiation fee.

SECTION 5. Membership shall consist of four categories: student, faculty, alumnus, and honorary. Students who have graduated and faculty who have terminated their employment shall become an alumnus member.

SECTION 6. Membership may be terminated by resignation or expulsion.

ARTICLE V. ORGANIZATION

SECTION 1. The affairs of this Chapter shall be conducted through an Executive Committee and members in good standing.

SECTION 2. The Executive Committee and student members in good standing shall have authority and responsibility for governing the affairs of this Chapter.

SECTION 3. The Executive Committee shall receive reports from appointed committees on administrative matters.

SECTION 4. The Executive Committee shall convene bi-weekly to review reports and consider other such matters as the appointed committees bring before it.

SECTION 5. The Chapter shall be convened two times during each quarter to conduct business meetings.

ARTICLE VI. DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution, any remaining net assets of the Chapter shall be distributed solely to other exempt organizations that qualify under the provisions of the Section 501(c)(3), as in effect January 1, 1987, or succeeding statutory provisions.

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENTS

The Constitution of the Chapter may be amended by two-thirds vote of the student members in good standing at an emergency or business meeting.
