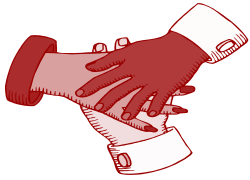

PURPOSE OF THE CONFERENCE

The purpose of this conference is to bring together scholars, students, professionals and community leaders interested in ethical issues requiring worldwide attention in the 21st century. Special attention will be given to ethical issues in education, the corporate world, the environment and human rights.

Kennesaw State University is pleased to host a three-day conference on global ethics to be held at the KSU Center, October 24-26, 2004. The Conference Steering Committee invites proposals for panels, papers, roundtables, and poster sessions on four major themes.

- **Education**

- **Environment & Sustainable Development**

Moral and ethical issues transcend national boundaries; global issues have increasingly raised questions of ethics and character. Leaders of various kinds (ethnic, corporate, non-profit, religious, national and international) have been scrutinized for their ethical behaviors in public and in private affairs. Advances in science and technology in the 20th century have raised ethical questions on the global scene. Will the leaders of the 21st century distinguish themselves from past leaders in their ethical behavior? What should be the response of leaders as the whole world faces threats of war and international terrorism, resurgence of slavery, environmental degradation, the needs of the growing population of elderly versus younger citizens, and the widening gap between rich and poor nations?

THEMES

Education-Subthemes might include education as a vehicle for realizing global ethical leadership, ethical ramifications of educational policies, and the scholarship of teaching ethics and/or leadership.

Corporate & Non-Profit Organizations-Subthemes might include the role of global corporations and non-profit agencies in promoting ethical behavior or the redistribution of wealth, corporate citizenship in a shrinking world, professional codes of ethics, and technological implications.

Human Rights-Subthemes might include the ethics underlying the rise of the new slavery, child labor and other forms of involuntary servitude; violence, terrorism and war; health care with special attention to HIV/AIDS; and the aging of the world's population as it impacts the use of global resources.

Environment & Sustainable Development-Subthemes might include the ethics of global wealth and poverty, dependency and interdependency, environmental justice, and sustainable development.

Please send your proposals of no more than two pages for blind review in an MS Word (preferred) or Rich Text Format (RTF) file by e-mail attachment to Joann Trodahl at jtrodahl@kennesaw.edu by **March 31, 2004**. You will receive notice of receipt of your proposal by e-mail. If you do not receive this notice within 7 days, please contact the Conference Steering Committee Chair, Dr. Akanmu Adebayo, at aadebayo@kennesaw.edu. You will also receive by e-mail notice of acceptance of your paper, panel, or poster session proposal for the conference. All proposals must have the following information:

- **Paper Title (if applicable)**
- **Panel Title (if applicable)** (please list name of all presenters)
- **Poster Title (if applicable)**
- **Abstract of proposal** (limit abstract to 300 words)
- **Technology and equipment needs**
