Types of Resources

The following is a description of the types of reference resources that are listed in this bibliography. These resources can be found on the first floor of Horace W. Sturgis Library in the Reference Area.

Almanac:

An almanac is a publication, usually annual, containing a large collection of facts and statistics. It can pertain to a particular subject, such as the Almanac of Native Americans, or to a broader collection of data, such as the World Almanac.

Annotated Bibliography:

An annotated bibliography is a list of citations to books, articles, and documents. Each citation is followed by a brief (usually about 150 words) descriptive and evaluative paragraph, the annotation. The purpose of the annotation is to inform the reader of the relevance, accuracy, and quality of the sources cited.

Atlas:

An atlas is a collection of maps, traditionally bound into book form, but also found in multimedia formats, such as on CD-ROM. As well as geographic features and political boundaries, many often feature geopolitical, social, religious and economic statistics.

Biography:

A biography is a carefully researched, relatively full account of the facts of the life of a particular person, or closely related group of people, written by another. The person written about is the biographee. As in any historical work, the biographer presents, in continuous narrative, the most interesting and important events, usually with the aim of elucidating character, personality, and social context.

Book of Quotations:

Quotations are used to illustrate points of your discussion, or as evidence to support your arguments. They should be selected carefully, and used as sparingly as possible. The sources of quotations should be given as endnotes or footnotes, and given in full bibliographical detail.

Dictionary:

A dictionary is a book which defines the terms of a language, profession, discipline, or specialized area of knowledge. The terms are arranged in alphabetical order. Usually, a language dictionary will give the spelling, pronunciation, and meaning of each word. A dictionary of the words and terms of a restricted field of knowledge gives only the meanings.

ABRIDGED DICTIONARIES limit themselves to the most commonly used words. UNABRIDGED DICTIONARIES aim at a much higher level of completeness.

Directory:

Directories are reference books which provide listing of people, associations, institutions, companies, etc., as well as identifying information as addresses, telephone numbers, personnel, publications, and other unique data (ND).

Encyclopedia:

An encyclopedia is a reference source containing information on a variety of terms, persons, and events. This information may be supplied in short paragraphs or in lengthy articles that include citations to other works on the same topic. Encyclopedias can be general, covering all topics, or specialized, focusing on a particular discipline such as art or philosophy.

Handbook:

A handbook provides general information source which provides quick reference for a given subject area. Handbooks are generally subject-specific.

Index:

An index is a guide to the material published within other works, sometimes within books but more often within periodicals. Periodical indexes list every article for the periodicals and the period covered, listed alphabetically by author, title, and subject. Indexes include the source information you'll need to find each article, usually the periodical title, issue number, and page numbers. Indexes are available in print and in electronic form.

Manual/Guide:

A book of rules for guidance or instructions in how to perform a task, process, etc.

Periodicals:

A periodical is a publication with a distinctive title, which appears in successive numbers or parts at stated or regular intervals and which is intended to continue indefinitely. Usually each issue contains articles written by different contributors. Includes journals, magazines, newspapers, newsletters sold by subscription or at bookstores and other vendors. Example: *Journal of Abnormal Psychology*, *Maclean's*, *Vancouver Sun*. Please note that they are available in different formats. These include **Current, Bound, Microfilm, IAC and Online (Web 1 and 2)**.

Criminal Justice Databases

The following Criminal Justice databases can be found on the Horace W. Sturgis Library website on the “Sturgis Library Electronic Resources” page. Once you are on this page, you may select the database alphabetically or by subject. All databases will have a direct link to the designated site so that you may have access. There will also be a link provided for “off campus access” for each database. Instructions are provided for off campus access. They may also be found in GALILEO.

Academic Search Premier (EBSCOhost) – provides abstracts and indexing for over 3,800, as well as full text for over 3,200 scholarly journals and general magazines. **Academic Search Premier** may be searched individually or in conjunction with other EBSCO databases. To search multiple EBSCO databases at one time, choose the menu entry for **EBSCOhost Databases** from the General Indexes category or the alphabetical list of databases.

Criminology: A SAGE Full-text Collection – includes the full-text of 21 journals published by SAGE and participating societies. It covers Criminal Justice, Juvenile Delinquency, Juvenile Justice, Corrections, Penology and Family and Domestic violence. It is updated weekly.

CQ (Congressional Quarterly) Electronic Library – Arts and Humanities, All Databases, Census and Government Publications, History, Law and Criminology, News/Facts and Reference, Political Science and Public Administration, Social Sciences.

Georgia Code – is the compilation of the laws of the state of Georgia that are currently in force. The database is searchable by keyword and by code number.

Georgia Legislative Documents – provide access to legislative resources. The database currently contains the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Georgia for the years 1799-1999, with a few gaps. In the future, additional documents will be added to include:

- Journal of the House of Representatives of the State of Georgia
- Journal of the Senate of the State of Georgia

The Acts are the actual text of the laws and resolutions as they were voted upon by the General Assembly. The text as published in the Acts is different from the text published in the Georgia Code.

The Journals outline the passage of bills and resolutions through each chamber of the General Assembly. The House of Representatives Journals to be included in the database were published 1781-1995; the Senate Journals to be included were published 1789-1995.

georgia.gov – Legislative Documents – provides access to both Georgia House and Senate bills. The database is searchable by keyword, bill number, code section, authors, co-signers, and committee sponsors. Also provided are the governor's budget and committee meeting schedules.

GeorgiaNet – Administrative Rules and Regulations – is a database of the rules and regulations governing the conduct of business in the state. The database may be searched by keyword and chapter, section, or rule numbers. Only selective chapter have been done.

GeorgiaNet – Attorney General's Office – maintains a web site of information on its staff, history, mission, organization, etc. Also provided is the ability to search the opinions of the Attorney General (1994-1997).

Lexis Nexis Academic – contains approximately 5,000 publications, virtually all include full text. Many types of publications are included: newspapers (in English, other languages, and translations of international papers), legal news,

general interest magazines, medical journals, trade publications, company financial information, transcripts, wire service reports, government publications (such as the federal case law, U.S. Code, Code of Federal Regulations, Congressional Testimony, etc.), law reviews, and reference works (such as the Forbes Annual Directory, the Official Guide/American Marketplace and the US Global Trade Outlook).

Research Library (ProQuest) – provides abstracts and indexing for over 2,600, as well as full text for over 1,700 scholarly journals and general magazines. Research Library is an expansion of, and replacement for, the database titled Periodical Abstracts Research II. The database may be searched individually or in conjunction with other ProQuest databases. To search multiple ProQuest databases at one time, choose the menu entry for **ProQuest Databases** from the Full-Text Journal/Newspaper Articles or General Indexes categories, or from the alphabetical list of databases, or choose the "Select Database" option on the ProQuest search screens.
