You will receive reminders through the *Funding Forum*, including the current edition, and email well in advance of these workshops. The more information you have regarding the external funding process, the more successful you will be in seeking and managing grants.

We look forward to working with faculty and staff during the new academic year. Please call OGC for all your proposal and grant questions. We also welcome your comments on how OGC can better serve you.

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## GRANT SEARCH TIPS AND TOOLS

By now most faculty and staff members have heard or read that grants.gov is the primary portal for finding and applying for federal grants. You may have already used the following web site to browse for opportunities by agency or by keyword: [http://www.grants.gov/applicants/find\\_grant\\_opportunities.jsp](http://www.grants.gov/applicants/find_grant_opportunities.jsp). Like many faculty, you may have found the sheer volume of information to be overwhelming, unhelpful, or irrelevant to your research and teaching interests.

You may also want information about private foundations and other sponsors in addition to the federal funding agencies such as the National Science Foundation, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the National Endowment for the Humanities. If so, there are a few tools you might try for conducting your own grant searches.

KSU purchases an annual subscription to the Grants Resource Center, a grant information service of the Association of American Colleges and Universities (AACU). Through this membership in GRC, KSU faculty and staff have access to two helpful grant search tools:

- GRC GrantSearch is a funding database that was developed to make finding federal and private foundation grant information accessible and convenient. You can search for opportunities using criteria such as academic subject, activity, and deadline month. You can also simply enter key words that reflect your areas of interest. To use this tool, start here <http://www.aascu.org/gsmodule/>. The site includes a user's guide with instructions and search tips.
- GRC Grant Deadlines is another option for finding grant opportunities. Updated each month, this publication lists only those opportunities that are open and accepting applications within the next three months. To browse GRC Grant Deadlines, click here: <http://www.aascu.org/grc/pubs/DL/D08/D08/Aug08.htm>.

The first time you use either of these tools, you may be prompted to enter a login and password. The login is **ksu** and the password is **proposal**. Please note that the login and password are to be used by KSU faculty and staff only. Friends and colleagues outside of KSU who are interested in using these tools should request membership and login information from their home institutions.

Tools and resources available through the Foundation Center may also be of interest to KSU faculty and staff seeking grants. The Foundation Center is a well known and widely respected organization that is dedicated to strengthening the philanthropic and nonprofit sector. Their grant search tools and information resources on U.S. grants and grantmakers are comprehensive, accurate, and often free. For example, they publish the online newsletter Philanthropy News Digest which allows users to browse current requests for proposals (RFPs) or sign up to receive these by email. Current RFPs are available here: <http://foundationcenter.org/pnd/rfp/>. The Foundation Center also offers free classes in grant seeking and basic proposal writing. The Foundation Center's focus is the nonprofit sector and not academia per se, but the RFPs and basic proposal writing training are likely to be of interest to many faculty members. When you find an opportunity that is of interest to you, please contact OGC as soon as possible. Use our handy online Notice of Intent to Apply form ([http://www.kennesaw.edu/ogc/Notice\\_of\\_Intent.htm](http://www.kennesaw.edu/ogc/Notice_of_Intent.htm)), send us an email, or just pick up the phone and call 770-423-6046. The sooner we know you want to apply, the more support we can provide for your proposal submission.

## “WHY SHOULD I WORRY ABOUT RESEARCH COMPLIANCE?”

When most faculty hear the term *research compliance*, they think about approval of the use of human participants in their research. While IRB approval is essential for research involving human participants, other types of compliance are just as important. You have likely heard the terms *conflict of interest* and *research misconduct*, but do you know what they mean? What about *export controls* and *time and effort reporting*?

This article will highlight what these forms of compliance mean to you and the University. Throughout this year, you will be receiving more in-depth information regarding research compliance.

### Conflict of Interest

When you see the term conflict of interest, financial conflict usually comes to mind. Conflicts of this type may compromise or appear to compromise a PI's professional judgment in conducting or reporting research. When a financial conflict exists, the PI and research administrators can devise ways to manage the conflict in most cases. However, if the conflict cannot be managed, either the PI must eliminate the financial relationship or the University must not accept funding from the sponsor.

Other kinds of conflict of interest are non-financial, such as conflict of commitment. Institutional conflicts of interest may also occur. These usually involve administrators or institutional investments.

### Research Misconduct

While conflict of interest generally relates to funded research, compliance with policies regarding research misconduct applies to any research whether funded or not. Research misconduct may include any of the following:

***Falsification:*** manipulating research materials, equipment, or processes to produce data or results that do not accurately represent the research

***Fabrication:*** making up data or results and recording or reporting them

***Plagiarism:*** the appropriation of another person's ideas, processes, or results without giving appropriate credit

PIs are responsible not only for their own behavior in the laboratory but also for the behavior of their student researchers. Teaching students about ethical behavior is just as important as teaching research techniques.

## RESEARCH COMPLIANCE, CONTINUED

### Export Controls

Abiding by the federal regulations regarding exporting equipment, inventions, or data is another area of compliance that applies to all research in the University. These regulations are not limited to research but include the sale or transfer of any of the above to a foreign entity. The federal regulations are extremely rigid, and criminal charges may result for violation of these regulations. Even unintentional violations can have serious consequences. For example, a retired professor from the University of Tennessee was convicted this month (September 2008) on 18 counts involving the Arms Export Control Act for permitting foreign graduate students to have access to information on an Air Force defense project. The professor could receive up to ten years in prison. <http://www.knoxnews.com/news/2008/sep/03/ex-ut-prof-guilty/> and <http://www.knoxnews.com/news/2008/sep/04/roth-case-may-be-lesson/>. If you wish to collaborate with an individual, group, or institution outside the United States, please contact the Office of Grants and Contracts. OGC can help you protect yourself and your research career.

### Time and Effort Reporting

Time and effort reports are required for all funded research and programs. This area of compliance is closely scrutinized by auditors when they review financial documents related to a grant. ***Time and effort reports must be completed each semester by employees who are paid from a grant and by employees who have committed a portion of their time to a grant, whether the funding is covered by the grant or by the University.***

Because of the importance of this area of compliance, PIs who do not complete the time and effort reports by the due date risk having their grant accounts frozen. Time and effort reports must be final at the time of submission, so please be sure they are correct, and please ask for help if you have questions.

While we all feel that we have too many rules to follow, it is imperative that researchers not jeopardize the funding opportunities of faculty by violating federal regulations. If you have a question regarding any compliance issue, please contact a staff member in Grants and Contracts. We are dedicated to guiding faculty through the regulatory maze, and we guarantee your inquiries will be kept confidential.



## NEW ROUTING FORM ONLINE

OGC has reworked the proposal routing form and requests that you discard any old versions you may have downloaded for use. The version that is to be used for all proposals as of October 1, 2008 is the September 2008 revision that is on the OGC website at <http://www.kennesaw.edu/ogc/Forms.htm>. Please use this latest version of the routing form for all your proposals, as it includes information we must collect and record.

Remember that you need to include a signed routing form when you forward your proposal to OGC and that the form must be on file before the proposal is submitted to the funding agency.

**2008-2009 WORKSHOP CALENDAR**

**Basics for KSU Grantseekers, Wed., Oct. 1, 12:30 – 2:30 p.m., Library; Fri., Oct. 24, 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m., KH 3427.** This workshop is for KSU faculty and staff who have an interest in grants but have never applied and just want some basic information about where to start. This is also a good refresher for those who used to apply for grants but have not done so in the past few years. Workshop includes a 15 minute introduction and two 45 minute segments with a 15 minute break. **Part 1** focuses on identifying opportunities using resources available to KSU faculty and staff. **Part 2** covers the proposal development process and internal procedures for submission. Part 2 will also briefly cover peer review and the process of revision and resubmission. Each two hour session includes both Part 1 and Part 2.

**Preparing Competitive NSF Proposals, Tues., Oct. 7, 2008, 1:00 – 3:00 p.m., KH 3427.** A panel of NSF administrators and program directors will lead detailed discussions on proposal preparation, the NSF merit review process, and agency guidance on conflict of interest issues. This webcast is for faculty who are interested in applying to the National Science Foundation, the federal funding agency that supports basic research in all fundamental scientific disciplines, including the social sciences. The format is a two-hour webcast, purchased through AASCU's Grants Resource Center and broadcast simultaneously with GRC's External Funding Conference in Washington, D.C.

**Business and International Education (BIE) Program, Wed., Oct. 15, 2:00 – 4:00 p.m., KH 3427.** The BIE Program promotes education and training that contribute to the ability of U.S. businesses to prosper in an international economy. Recently funded projects focus on Central and South Asia, the Middle East, Russia, the Independent States of the former Soviet Union, and Africa. This webcast is for faculty members who have an interest in improving the teaching of business curricula and conducting outreach activities that expand the capacity of the business community to engage in international economic activities. Tanyelle Richardson, Program Officer within the U.S. Department of Education, will lead this GRC web conference. During this web conference, Richardson will discuss what to expect for the upcoming FY 09 competition.

**NIH AREA Workshop, Thurs., Nov. 6, 2:30– 4:30 p.m., KH 3427.** AREA grants are for small research projects in the biomedical and behavioral sciences conducted by faculty and undergraduate researchers at institutions that have not been major recipients of NIH research grants. This workshop is for KSU faculty with biomedical or health related research interests. The first half of the workshop will give an overview of the AREA program, what kinds of projects are eligible, and how to get started developing your own proposal. During the second half, we will discuss a sample proposal and cover all the pieces that are required for a complete application. Two hour small-group format, with 15 minute break in the middle.

**NSF RUI Workshop, Fri., Nov. 14, 12:30– 2:00 p.m., KH 3427.** This workshop covers all the advantages of applying for research support under the National Science Foundation's Research at Undergraduate Institutions funding mechanism. Intended audience includes all faculty whose research interests lie in non-medical fields of fundamental science, including the social sciences. Small-group format, about an hour of presentation and then a half-hour of discussion and Q&A. Bring your lunch if you like.

**How Communicating with Program Officers Can Help You Win Grants, Time and location TBA.** Program officers at federal grantmaking agencies serve a very important role. They serve as liaison between the sponsor and the research community. Communicating with your program officer is a key step in securing external funding. This workshop will give you tips and suggestions for making initial contact, following up, and even visiting POs in person. Sample emails and phone scripts will be shared and discussed. This workshop is of general interest to faculty and staff in all fields, but of particular interest to faculty who are hesitant to call or email program officers to discuss their research agenda or ask questions about funding opportunities. If you want to be able to do this with greater confidence, this workshop is for you.

**Special Workshops for Deans and Chairs: How to Support Your Faculty in Seeking Grants, Time and location TBA.** Chairs and deans know that external funding builds research infrastructure and enhances the overall success and growth of their departments and colleges. This workshop is for any chairs and deans who want to learn more about how to remove barriers in support of their faculty's quest for external funding.

## **A NEW TOOL FOR FINDING GRANT INFORMATION: THE FACULTY GRANT ALERT SYSTEM**

Beginning this semester, there is a new tool available to help you find grants that match your research and program interests. The Faculty Grant Alert System enables you to receive direct email alerts about grant opportunities in your field. The system is one of the resources available to our campus through KSU's membership subscription to AASCU's Grants Resource Center.

Faculty members who want to sign up for grant alerts fill out a simple online form with contact information, fields of expertise, and types of support that are of interest. The form takes 5 to 10 minutes to complete. The information is routed electronically through OGC to AASCU's Grants Resource Center. Participating faculty should begin receiving targeted grant information within two to three weeks of registering.

We piloted this system informally for several months with about 15 faculty members who agreed to test drive it and offer feedback. Pilot testers submitted registration information, received grant alert emails for three months, and spent some time sharing their thoughts and recommendations on the new system. Most were happy with the information they received and offered constructive criticism for KSU to share with the system's developers at Grants Resource Center.

This is an opt-in system. You will not be added to the list unless you tell us to do so by completing the registration form. If you add yourself and then discover you don't like it, you can be removed upon your request. Moreover, the Grants Resource Center has assured us in writing that the information you provide is used strictly for the purpose of supplying you with relevant grant opportunities, and your information will not be distributed to any other persons or groups.

## “I GOT THE GRANT ... NOW WHAT?”

A grant award notice brings a great deal of excitement and promise. The principal investigator's first thoughts are likely to be of successful research and scholarly activities, publications, recognition in his or her field, and a solid academic career.

However, acceptance of an externally funded award also brings fiduciary responsibility, including compliance with the sponsor's conditions governing expenditures and reporting. Principal investigators, even those with virtually no accounting experience, are expected to ensure that expenditures from their sponsored projects are appropriate, allowable under the conditions of the award, and in compliance with the policies of the sponsor as well as with the regulations of the University.



Kennesaw State University does not maintain a separate set of financial policies applicable solely to grants and contracts. Rather, all KSU policies apply to all transactions, irrespective of funding source, unless otherwise noted in the contract or grant agreement. As you begin to conduct your project, you may find yourself trying to make sense of rules and procedures that you never knew existed. Moreover, even if you are accustomed to spending hours analyzing data and absorbing scholarly material, the terms and conditions pages of your award just might make your head spin.

Most PIs care deeply about their work and want to be able to count on continued funding. Most PIs want to know what exactly they are supposed to do and where to turn for help and support. This is why the Office of Grants and Contracts assigns each PI an Accounting Professional who will answer questions, discuss discrepancies, and help resolve issues.

Ideally, the Accounting Professional and the PI work together as a team. Each has expertise that the other needs. The Accounting Professional's responsibilities include approving grant expenditures and providing the PI with monthly reports. The PI's responsibilities include **reviewing those monthly reports and immediately notifying the Office of Grants and Contracts Post Award staff of any discrepancies.** Notification of any discrepancy should be made by the PI within 10 days of receiving the report. PIs who need a refresher on how to read those reports can use this training presentation entitled “How to Read Your Monthly Reports”: <http://www.kennesaw.edu/budgets/grants/tp.htm>.

As PI, you have been entrusted by your sponsor and by the University with the scientific, technical, and financial direction of the award. Any time you detect a discrepancy or have financial questions, you should contact your assigned Accounting Professional for help and support. By reviewing reports in a timely manner and requesting help as soon as issues arise, you can protect yourself and your research by helping to ensure that only allowable, reasonable, and allocable costs are charged to your grant or contract.



## SUBMITTING MULTIPLE PROPOSALS FOR A SINGLE COMPETITION

Last year KSU faculty submitted about 150 proposals. We expect this number to climb in years to come. Every day OGC sends grant information to individuals, departments, and other groups, and more faculty are using the available search tools on their own. So what happens when more than one faculty member wants to submit a proposal for the same grant program?

The answer depends primarily upon the sponsor's rules. Many sponsors are perfectly happy to accept multiple proposals for a single competition. The National Science Foundation's Course Curriculum and Laboratory Improvement program and the Department of Education's Institute of Education Sciences program are two examples of competitions to which KSU regularly sends multiple proposals. The National Endowment for the Humanities usually accepts multiple proposals from a single institution as well.

There are also times when agencies restrict the number of proposals or applications that an institution may submit response to a given program. For example, the National Science Foundation's Major Research Instrumentation program permits a maximum of three proposals. The recently announced HASTAC competition from the MacArthur Foundation permits an institution to be the primary applicant on only one proposal, but still allows applicants to be non-lead partners on more than one. The State Department, on the other hand, is an agency that often limits submissions to one per organization, whether as a lead or non-lead partner. Similarly, the National Endowment for the Arts limits most competitions to one per applicant, but makes exceptions for organizations that have "more than one eligible component," as determined in consultation with Arts Endowment staff.

In general, application limits are the sponsor's call, and the university will support as many applications as the sponsor allows.

Faculty and staff who plan to prepare a proposal for a program with a submission limit should notify OGC of their intent as soon as possible. However, being the first to submit the [intent to apply](#) form does not guarantee the right to submit. To ensure fairness to all and prevent multiple PIs from spending time developing their proposals, only to discover that the University is allowed to submit only one, KSU has a specific process for handling limited submissions.

This process begins four weeks prior to the competition deadline. Each potential project director must submit a one-page abstract to OGC. If fewer abstracts are received than the number of applications allowed by the agency, all proposals will be submitted for that deadline. If more abstracts are received than the number allowed by the agency, then the abstracts will be reviewed by a committee of faculty appointed by the Associate Dean for Grants and Contracts. This review committee will serve a one-year term.

The recommendations of the faculty committee will be forwarded to the Dean of the Graduate College, who will make the final decision regarding which proposal(s) will be submitted. In the event that two or more proposals might be combined and submitted, the committee could make this suggestion to the Dean.

Occasionally, an agency will release a request for proposals with fewer than four weeks to go before deadline. In such cases, the same policies and procedures apply, but the internal competition is expedited accordingly.
