The Paul & Daisy Soros Fellowship for New Americans

The Fellowships are grants for up to two years of graduate study in the United States. A *New American* is an individual who (1) is a resident alien; i.e., holds a Green Card, or, (2) has been naturalized as a U.S. citizen, or (3) is the child of two parents who are both naturalized citizens. Each year the Fellow receives a maintenance grant of \$20,000 and a tuition grant of one-half the tuition cost of the U.S. graduate program. A Fellow may pursue a graduate degree in any professional field or scholarly discipline in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences. The deadline is November 1, 2006.
