DIRECTOR'S NOTE

"We're dying in America to come into our own. But when you're dying in America at the end of the millenium, you're not alone" ~ "What You Own"

We've thought a lot about what *RENT* means to us in 2023. This play isn't about one thing or one theme. While the play addresses the HIV/AIDS crisis head on, the themes of *RENT* also directly address homelessness, poverty, and gentrification. Modern audiences know that being behind on rent isn't far-fetched because most people live paycheck to paycheck, regardless of their level of education or rigorous work ethic. As Americans, we don't have many opportunities to let our anger out against the structures that confine us... government, patriarchy, institutions, capitalism... the list goes on. So, instead of punching up, we punch to the side. Americans have become greatly polarized in their viewpoints and their politics. *RENT* reminds us how to handle these emotions and these challenges with joy, resourcefulness, and love, in every season.

At the time when *RENT* debuted, the term used to describe its multifaceted nature would have been "multiculturalism," defined as "the state of a society or the world in which there exists numerous distinct ethnic and cultural groups seen to be politically relevant." Nevertheless, we think "intersectionality" is the best term to describe the themes of the play because it recognizes that people can have overlapping marginalized identities, which can marginalize them even further. In *RENT*, there are many characters with intersectionalities. They humanize a variety of marginalized communities and help a modern audience to understand the privileges they have in order to use those privileges for good.

RENT is raw, much like its setting – the East Village and Lower East Side of Manhattan in the 1990s – and much like the group of students involved in our production. The show is unrefined, since its writer, Jonathan Larson, passed away the day of its debut Off-Broadway. With more time on this planet, we presume that Jonathan Larson would have been able to polish and update the piece as it moved to Broadway, to the regional markets, and through the changing times. The show has often been criticized for its plot holes, inconsistencies, and politically incorrect ways of documenting the intersectionalities of marginalized individuals. Our students understand these shortcomings and have attacked learning the piece with passion, curiosity, and humor. Our students certainly follow their impulses, whether it's filming the latest TikTok trend or having a heated debate over a political issue. Generation Z has grown up in the face of a lot of adversity, including the Covid-19 pandemic, and moves through the world with a lot of the weight already embedded in this script, this score, and these characters. Their raw hearts allow this rock score to truly soar with the grit and hormones, as the writer intended.

Upon entering the theater, you probably noticed quilts on either side of the stage. These are just two of the thousands of pieces of the AIDS Memorial Quilt. We are honored to be the only current hosts of the AIDS Memorial Quilt in the entire Southeast region of the United States. This quilt was built out of love for the human beings that we have lost too soon to AIDS. *RENT* attempts to humanize the stories of those affected by AIDS as well as additional ills of our society. Please take some time to check out the thorough dramaturgy materials in the lobby and on our website. Please take a moment to reflect with the quilt and your fellow audience members; we have student docents available to tell you more about the exhibit.
