

Employer Guide to Hiring F-1 Visa Students

International students on an F-1 visa have the opportunity to work off campus to gain practical experience related to their degree. Students must have work authorization before beginning their training experience. There are two primary types of authorizations—Curricular Practical Training (CPT) and Optional Practical Training (OPT). CPT is generally used by students during their degree program and OPT is for students after they graduate. Neither one has any cost for the employer.

Curricular Practical Training (CPT) [Current Students]

- Used for internships, field placements, clinicals and other practical training experiences that are integral to the completion of a degree
- Experiences can be paid or unpaid
- Requires that a student register for an internship or other appropriate course. Registration
 must be during the same semester as the internship.
- Authorized by the International Student & Scholar Services Office, often in about one week
- Granted for one semester at a time
- Available to students who have been in status for at least 2 semesters

Optional Practical Training (OPT) [Graduating Students & Alumni]

- Used for post-graduation work opportunities, with limited exceptions
- Work experiences must be related to a student's major and commensurate with their degree
- Can be authorized for up to 36 months total, depending on a student's field of study
- Starts with an application to the International Student & Scholar Services Office but also
 requires approval from US Citizenship & Immigration Services (3-4 months total processing time)
