

#10 Use KSU's <u>uHoo Learning Analytics</u> to monitor students' progress so you can take evidencebased actions to support them.

As the website from <u>Curriculum, Instruction, Assessment</u> states, there are multiple benefits of utilizing uHoo Analytics. Not only does it support student success, but it also benefits you as an instructor. If you are utilizing D2L for your course(s), you should consider learning more about uHoo Analytics to prepare for next year.

Support Student Success:

- Improve your data-informed decision-making.
- Customize learning experiences to meet students' needs.
- **Collect** real-time feedback on student learning and instructional strategies.
- Facilitate communications and engagement with students.
- Create opportunities for early intervention and support.


Benefits for Instructors

- Flexibility and Freedom: Make D2L work for you to free up your time for other KSU and college demands.

SoTL Spotlight

This month we shine a SoTL Spotlight on Dr. Amy Gruss of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering for her \$200,000 NSF grant, "Developing Perspective-Taking in First-Year Engineering Students Using Arts-Based Observation." Her research, in partnership with Dr. Tripp Shealy of Virginia Tech, examines students' development of perspective-taking and critical observation skills as they tour the Zuckerman Museum of Art using guided observation techniques. Students then incorporate what they learn into their design projects with the purpose of understanding stakeholders' needs. According to Dr. Gruss,



"Not only is the grant valuable because it expands the students' active listening and critical thinking skills which are necessary for engineering design, but art captures emotions, culture, and history, helping people understand different perspectives and develop empathy—key traits for ethical decision-making and leadership."
