On Campus Engagement

IAEP Certificates

Internal Audit and related courses are thriving at KSU. To earn the Internal Audit Educational Partnership (IAEP) Certificate, students must complete five courses including Accounting Information Systems, Auditing and Assurance, Accounting Data Analytics, Fraud and Forensic Accounting, and Internal Auditing. We issued 86 IAEP Certificates this year. In 2024-2025, 63 students successfully completed the necessary undergraduate courses to earn the IAEP Certificate awarded by the Institute of Internal Auditors. Additionally, 23 students completed the Master of Accounting specializing in Audit/Advisory and earned their IAEP Certificate.



IA/Advisory Student Day

In October 2024, Kennesaw hosted the 19th Annual Internal Audit/Advisory Student Day and Career Fair. 25 firms and over 130 students attended the event. Four schools around Georgia were represented. Students had the opportunity hear from a panel pictured
