 - 1. PTFC Overarching Goals current status Talking Points

PTFC Overarching Recommendation—Creation of part-time and temporary faculty task force to examine transparency and consistency regarding the role, assignment, compensation, and support of PT and temp faculty and to make recommendations to enhance or amend procedures and policies that support PT and temp faculty as professionals who contribute to the mission and goals of KSU and serve student needs.
- B. James Stinchcomb Qualtrics survey review (is there a policy, who is currently responsible, who should be responsible).
 - 1. Piloted in Spring 19 with department chairs, received seven responses.
 - 2. Discovered 54% have changed since last year. Survey revised to solicit new feedback.
 - 3. Decided to break questions apart for simplicity and not require comments or force responses for submission.
 - 4. Sending updated anonymous electronical survey to all part-time faculty to collect data and produce reports regarding results and summary for review.
 - 5. Added the "I Don't Know" category to survey for more accurate results.
 6. November 22nd deadline for survey.
 7. December 2nd deadline for review of results in next meeting.

Israeli Folk Dancing Event

My name is Ruti (Ruth) Padan and I am part time - teaching Hebrew and Biblical Hebrew. Teaching a language is not only vocabulary and grammar. Exposing students to culture of the country who speak the language you teach is an important part of teaching a language.

ISRAELI FOLK DANCING is a big part of Israel culture. It is a very special and unique way of dancing. Each song is choreographed so if you dance in Tel Aviv or any other place for the same music you do the same steps. It is popular not only in Israel but all over the world. I danced in many cities in Israel but also in New York, London, Berlin, and there is also a group in Taiwan. The dances are in circles, line and couples. In Israel there lots of dancing workshops in every city and small towns having 100 or 200 average of participants, and in Tel Aviv university the group has 1500 dancers (not necessarily students).

At KSU we have Israeli folk dancing workshop once a year in the fall semester lead by a professional dancer and teacher Meliss Jakubovic. This semester it was held on November 5th at the student center and we had 100 participants, while my Hebrew class is only 10 students. It was lots of fun, good music, and very enjoyable.—Ruti Padan
