Some cultural products are imported, some translated and dubbed, and some influences are less clear. France is represented in Japan through pastries, literature, and a love of Paris (and its unfortunate side effect of the Paris Syndrome). Manga and anime draw heavily on European influences. This course will explore the surprising connections between France and Japan, bringing these two disparate countries, cultures, and traditions together.
