<p>City as Text is an interdisciplinary investigation of the people, architecture, culture, history, and changing demographics of Savannah, GA. During the two-week Maymester, students will first travel to Savannah, GA for three nights to experience the city. In the second week, students will further discuss their experiences and engage in reflective assignments.</p> <p>For students whose state-funded financial aid (Zell, Hope) will not cover the tuition costs, the KSU Journey Honors College will provide \$1225 in scholarship funds to offset in-state tuition and fees for this City as Text course.</p>				

Travel to Savannah, GA will occur from Monday, May 15 through Thursday, May 18<sup>th</sup>. Transport to and hotel costs in Savannah will be covered; breakfasts will be included at the hotel, but students will be responsible for other meal costs.
