This course is titled "Remembering the Past". HOW we remember the past is just as important as what really happened. In this discovery, we will look at a several examples of historic memory to see WHY we remember things as we do—how these "memories" shape our social and cultural identity, for example, and how businesses have shaped or even created these memories for profit.

<p>This course is titled “Using Art Exhibits to Improve Communication in Engineers”. This course uses Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS) to observe art in the Zuckerman Museum of Art (ZMA) as a way for students to become better science communicators and become comfortable with ambiguity. VTS is guided by facilitators to walk students through the art their viewing by asking questions rather than adding their own opinion or information about the artwork. Additionally, research has shown that VTS can lead to a better understanding of history, culture, and empathy for others. Reflections will be discussed in class after visiting the ZMA to tie the experience at the art exhibit to how engineers work in teams, communicate, and listen. This Honors Discovery is open to all majors, especially those with non-art backgrounds.</p>

<p>This course is titled “What does it mean to be human?”. Humans are biological beings and we share common biological features with our primate relatives. However, there are characteristics of humans that make us significantly different from other animals. In this Honors Discovery, we will examine how anthropologists grapple with the concept of what it means to be human and how we can uncover the roots of our humanness in the archaeological and fossil record.</p>

<p>This course is titled “International Intrigue: Cultural Competence and Human Nature”. This course will explore diverse international themes, including but not limited to the following: international relations in diverse regions; the role of human nature in international studies; student leadership roles making informed decisions regarding cross-cultural issues; relevant literary sources (novels, short stories) which enlighten cultural knowledge and understanding of human nature; and the of exercising critical and creative thinking skills to enhance student decision making amidst diversity of cultures as well as thought.</p>

The title for this course is Narrations: Modern Ireland and the Short Story. According to renowned short story writer Frank O’Connor, “The novel by its very nature presupposes a group, a social system that can absorb the lonely figure. The short story is the art form that deals with the individual when there is no longer a society to absorb him, and when he is compelled to exist, as it were, by his own inner light.”

In this one credit-hour Honors colloquium, students will explore the provocative genre of the short story through the lens of modern Irish literature.

Originating from a land historically fraught and long politically and culturally divided, Irish literature remains one of the world’s richest repositories of artistic endeavor. Using the region as the primary category of analysis—both as textual backdrop and authorial homeland—students will be introduced to the short stories of writers including

James Joyce, William Butler Yeats, Maria Edgeworth, and Colum McCann, to name but a few. Through the lens of a rich and diverse collection of narratives, we will explore the genre of the short story and investigate its craft. In addition, participants in the seminar will have the opportunity to try their own pens at the creative medium, as well as to articulate the features that make a good story “work.” Complementary topics including Irish culture, society, gender, religious affiliation, and point of view will be considered in detail.
