<p>This course examines civil rights in the twentieth century in Atlanta. Students will explore notable moments in the city's history: the Atlanta Race Riot (1906), the lynching of Leo Frank (1915), the Temple Bombing (1958), Dr. Martin Luther King's Nobel Prize dinner (1964), and the transformation of Atlanta since the 1970s with guest speaker Lee Rhyant, the first African American head of Lockheed Martin-Marietta and author of <i>Soaring: Eleven Guiding Principles on the Road from Segregation to Success</i> (UGA Press, 2022).</p>				
<b>HON 2400/03</b> <b>(0 credit hours)</b>	<b>Honors Discovery: The Craft of Argument</b>	13688	Dylan Goldblatt	TH: 8:00pm–10:00pm (Kennesaw) 7-week II
<p>Students will discover how to build arguments, persuade others through thoughtful debate, and craft highly compelling research projects in this course. This seminar functions as a primer for increasing your effectiveness as a communicator.</p>

<p>The United Nations has set an Agenda for Sustainable Development and related Sustainable Development Goals to advance people, planet and prosperity. Through this team-based experience, students will explore complex global issues, current strategies and initiatives, and opportunities for leadership and impact as engaged citizens.</p> <p>This course will meet once every other week for 10 weeks across the semester.</p>

<p>Federal agencies have identified and prioritized issues and initiatives for funding. Students will explore the landscape of federal grant funding through these priorities. Students will then reflect on the opportunities for engagement and societal impact, including related to their major field of study.</p> <p>This course will meet once every other week for 10 weeks across the semester.</p>				
<b>HON 2400/06 (0 credit hours)</b>	<b>Honors Discovery: Gene Editing and the Future of the Human Race</b>	16996	Clint Penick	T: 5:00pm–7:00pm (Kennesaw)
<p>There have been three major technological advances in the modern era: splitting the atom, creating the Internet, and decoding the human genome. This course will focus on the latter by exploring the creation of new gene editing tools as told in the book <i>The Code Breaker</i> by Walter Isaacson. This book chronicles the life and work of Jennifer Doudna, who received the 2020 Nobel Prize in Chemistry for developing the CRISPR/Cas9 gene editing system. Students will read sections of <i>The Code Breaker</i> and lead discussions on topics that include the scientific basis of gene editing, its applications, and the ethics of altering the human genome. This course will also consider the role of diversity in science as it relates to Doudna’s story.</p> <p>This course will meet once every other week for 10 weeks across the semester.</p>
