"There is perhaps no more succinct statement of the ethos of Critical Prison Studies, than political activist and socialist Eugene Debs' famous claim that "while there is a soul in prison, I am not free." The goal of this talk is to introduce the field of Critical Prison Studies, a field that argues not only for the abolition of prisons but for a rethinking of the nature of crime, policing, justice, inequality, and harm reduction."
