The Master of Science in International Policy Management (MSIPM) is a cohort-based online degree program that builds on Kennesaw State University's long-standing commitment to international education. The program prepares future leaders in the private and public sectors to understand how interactions among politics, institutions, and culture impact political processes and help shape policy outcomes.

CONTENT RICH

The MSIPM program is tailored for those who seek a greater practical understanding of global politics and policy. The curriculum promotes the development of an applied skillset that can be utilized in a range of work settings. A highlight of the program is the ten-day global experience. The trip affords students an opportunity to see program content "come to life" in a real-world setting.

ONLINE DELIVERY

The MSIPM program is designed to accommodate today's 24/7 work world where frequent travel, temporary work assignments, and even relocation are a reality. The flexibility offered by online delivery is perfect for those for whom a traditional "on-campus" experience is not a practical option.

CAREER FOCUSED

The MSIPM program cultivates the knowledge and skills employers are looking for. MSIPM graduates have found rewarding employment in federal and state agencies, international nongovernmental organization, and private corporations. MSIPM grads have found employment at such varied organizations as The U.S. State

Department, McKinsey & Company Consultancy, Novo Nordisk Pharmaceuticals, The International Rescue Committee, Georgia Ports Authority, and many more.

The MSIPM program employs a cohortstyle model of program delivery. Students take all coursework together. This togetherness reduces the sense of isolation that often plagues online degree programs. Our cohorts develop a camaraderie and unity of purpose that enhances the learning environment and leads to better educational outcomes.

THE MSIPM PROGRAM

COHORT-BASED LEARNING

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

The MSIPM program is a 33 semesterhour course of study. Students begin in August of year one and complete the program in May of year two. Students take 2 courses per term. Program courses are offered in a predetermined sequence. Due to the highly structured curriculum, students can finish the program in as little as 20 months.

MEET THE GLOBAL CHALLENGE *Program Characteristics and Curriculum*

In today's increasingly globalized world events unfolding in one country can affect people, commerce, and politics across the globe. Kennesaw State's Master of Science in International Policy Management prepares students to navigate the challenges and opportunities associated with today's interconnected political and commercial environment.

The program provides advanced academic skills for understanding policy structures and policy-making processes. Students are sensitized to the interaction between politics, institutions, and culture. They explore how these interactions shape policy outcomes. During the course of stay, students will learn how to assess political risk, manage conflict, measure the impact of politics on commerce, and deal with cultural nuances in negotiation.

IPM 7760: THE GLOBAL EXPERIENCE

At Kennesaw State University we believe that travel—especially global travel— enriches a student's knowledge of international policy and enhances learning.

The MSIPM curriculum includes a 10day study visit to Geneva, Switzerland. In Geneva, students engage policy managers in the professional settings where they work. Students meet with officials from the United Nations, World Trade Organization, World Health Organization, and other international organizations. The purpose is to give students an opportunity to see program content "come to life" in a real world setting.

DISTANCE LEARNING

The MSIPM program meets students where they are. All MSIPM courses are taught at a distance, with the exception of the Global Experience. The online delivery format is ideal for students who wish to complete an advanced degree while continuing in their current employment—whether they work around the corner or live on the other side of the globe. There's no driving to campus and no looking for parking. Students complete their degree from the comfort of their own home...or, as the case may be, from a seat on an airplane, or at a hotel room desk.

LEADING TECHNOLOGIES

MSIPM faculty have receive specialized training in online pedagogies. All courses are designed specifically for the online environment and employ the latest online technologies. This combination of faculty preparation and intentional course design insures that students receive the best quality education for their money.

MAXIMUM FLEXIBILITY

Flexibility is a watchword for the MSIPM program. Faculty designed the curriculum with busy students in mind. At the same time, the program is structured and rigorous. Students can expect to be challenged, but they can also expect program faculty to be mindful that "life happens".

ORIENTATION: PREPARING FOR SUCCESS

Students in each incoming cohort attend an on-campus orientation prior to their first semester of coursework. Students are introduced to course software, meet program faculty, and begin to develop relationships with those in their cohort. The purpose is to provide students with the information they require to successfully complete the program.



SPOTLIGHT: FACULTY EXPERTISE

A graduate program is only as good as the faculty who deliver it. The MSIPM program does not subcontract with instructional faculty. All MSIPM faculty are full time members of Kennesaw State's Department of Political Science and International Affairs. Our faculty are highly qualified, experienced, and fully credentialed. Our faculty hold advanced degrees from institutions such as John Hopkins University, Vanderbilt University, Emory University, George Washington University, American University, Indiana University, and the London

School of Economics. MSIPM faculty have a wide range of expertise. Our faculty are acknowledged experts in foreign policy, security, conflict management, trade and development. Their research spans such substantive policy issues as international terrorism, refugee and migration policy, international law and organization, and environmental policy. MSIPM faculty expertise also covers most geographical regions including Europe, the Middle East, Africa, Latin America, and Asia (especially China and India).

IPM 7765 CAPSTONE: PRACTICUM OR THESIS

All students will select a capstone path that includes either a practical work experience or a traditional Master's thesis. The work experience can take the form of an internship (paid or unpaid) or a practicum.

Internship or practicum experiences are varied and can be tailored to reflect a student's personal interests and policy focus. All students-whether doing an internship or practicum-will also complete a capstone project. The project involves developing a research plan, identifying appropriate methodologies, collecting data, conducting analyses, and making informed policy recommendations.

The MSIPM Director will be glad to discuss the range of internship opportunities available.

HOW TO APPLY Application Procedures, Scholarships, and Student Opportunities

HOW TO APPLY

Applicants must submit the following credentials to the KSU Graduate Admissions Office.

1. ONLINE APPLICATION

An application to the Graduate Admissions Office and a non-refundable fee. For the application, visit graduate.kennesaw.edu

2. OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

Official transcripts from each institution of higher education attended, except KSU.

3. TEST SCORES

Official GRE, GMAT, or LSAT scores. Scores should be sent directly to KSU. *NOTE* Waivers are available for those who hold a graduate degree or have an undergraduate GPA of 3.3 or better. Please contact us to request a waiver.

4. LETTER OF INTENT

An application letter outlining your goals for work in the program, including a rationale for why/how this program will meet your professional needs.

5. WRITING SAMPLE

A writing sample of approximately five pages. The sample may come from previous course work at the undergraduate or graduate level, or from professional (workrelated) writing.

6. LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

(Optional) Two letters of recommendation from those with direct knowledge of your academic abilities or professional experiences.

7. INTERNATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Official TOEFL or IELTS scores are required for international applicants. Scores should be sent directly to KSU. See "how to apply" and "international student" section of graduate.kennesaw.edu.

SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL AID

The majority of MSIPM students receive some sort of financial aid, whether through private scholarships, federal student loans, or Graduate Research Assistant (GRA) positions.

FAFSA APPLICATION

Federal financial aid is available to all U.S. citizens and to those international students who hold a green card. We recommend that all eligible students complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) when applying to the program. The FAFSA application is available at studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa.

LOANS

Most graduate students are eligible for federal subsidized or unsubsidized loans and for Graduate Plus loans. For more information, visit KSU's Office of Student Financial Aid at financialaid.kennesaw edu.

GRADUATE RESEARCH ASSISTANTSHIPS

MSIPM students are eligible to be considered for Graduate Research Assistantship (GRA) positions. GRAs work 10-20 hours per week with a supervising faculty member on a research project. GRAs receive a tuition waiver for up to 9 credit hours. GRAs also receive a monthly stipend. For more information, visit the GRA Job Board at gradassistantships.kennesaw.edu.
