BUILDING CONNECTION TO ENHANCE SUICIDE PREVENTION



WHAT DID AMES DO?

Collaborating with the Georgia Department of Veterans Service (GDVS), the AMES Research Center hosted the Let's Connect Summit on May 24 and 25, 2023 at the KSU Center. The two-day event focused on building relationships among the professionals and organizations who attended to provide suicide prevention and related services to service members, veterans, and their families to ultimately provide better, more connected services. HOW DOES THIS APPLY TO MILITARY, VETERANS, AND EMERGENCY SERVICES?

Military service members, veterans, and emergency services professionals are at increased risk to die by suicide compared to the general population. Addressing suicide risk requires focusing on many factors that influence quality of life, including addressing mental and physical health, housing insecurity, financial needs, social needs, and other factors. When professionals and organizations work together, they can address these suicide risk factors in a more comprehensive and coordinated way.

Provide time and space for parties to share information with each other.
