Golden Owl Member **Spotlight**

Linda Akanbi, Ph.D. Professor Emerita of Reading Education



In 1992, Linda Akanbi made history by being hired as the first African American female to head an academic department at Kennesaw State University. She was hired as Chair of the Elementary and Early Childhood Education Department.

Besides serving as Chair for 7 years, Linda also served as the Director of the Reading Institute in Bagwell College of Education, Coordinator for the Ford Foundation Teacher-Scholar program, Director of the Future Scholars Summer Program for High School Students, and was a member of the Leadership KSU class of 1992-1993. She also leaves a legacy of supporting students with her Dr. Linda B Akanbi Annual Scholarship for Education Majors.

In her retirement, Linda has kept quite busy. As her family's historian, she wrote a personal memoir, My Father's Daughter: An Untold Story, which follows the on-again, off-again relationship between a woman and estranged father after she learns the truth. also started her own company, ARS Educational Services, to provide consultant services to parents, schools and daycare centers seeking solutions to literacy development and literacy underachievement for their students. Linda also listening to music, traveling enjoys decorating.

Avoiding Cyber Fraud Highlights from the March 25 Brown Bag

- 1. Don't respond to unknown contacts if you don't recognize a phone number, email or text, it's okay not to answer or reply
- 2. Watch for urgency scammers use high-pressure tactics to create fear or urgency; take your time and don't rush into decisions.
- 3. Be skeptical research any claims made in unexpected messages or calls before acting on them - don't trust unsolicited information
- 4. Make sure you are shopping on valid websites; check the URL (uniform resource locator, the unique address for that online entity) for correct spelling of the company name.
- 5. Use two-factor authentication where available; the KSU email system uses such a method, called "DUO"
- 6. Agree on a code word among loved ones/family in advance in case you get a fake emergency call from a fraudster pretending to be one of them.

Survey Results

Here are key points from the survey sent out last fall. Eighty-three (83) retirees completed the survey.



- 99% of respondents prefer to hear from us by email.
- 26% often or very often participate in Association events.
- 46% participated in an event in the past 12 months.
- When asked what types of activities were of interest "information workshops" (73%) and "social events" (59%) were selected by more than half of respondents.
- When asked why you have not participated in events "geographic distance" (42%) and "other commitments" (45%) were common answers.
- The survey respondents were 57% faculty and 43% staff; 72% female and 26% male.

The survey results will be used by the co-chairs and Steering Committee in planning future events. Thank you to everyone that completed the survey. Also, thank you to Chris Ziegler and Suzy Millwood for working on the survey!

Retirees Legacy Scholarship Info

The KSU Retirees Association has two scholarship funds for KSU students. Our annual scholarship fund depends on donations each year, while our endowed scholarship fund will provide scholarships for the future. Through donations and fundraising activities, we have provided scholarships to more than 50 students who are children, grandchildren, or great-grandchildren of former Kennesaw State University or Southern Polytechnic State University faculty or staff members.

In total, the KSU Retirees Association has raised over \$100,000 for the endowed scholarship since the association began. Here are the amounts raised in recent years.


