- B. First Amendment and KSU Policy Presentation- Nwakaego Nkumeh Walker and Breana Ware
 - Purpose is to assist with legal issues within the University and consult with cabinets, deans, and chairs
 - First Amendment protects peoples' speech
 - Applies to public colleges, including KSU
 - Senate Bill 339 requires KSU to adopt policies that protect free speech
 - Even if speech is offensive, KSU has to protect it because of the First Amendment
 - KSU is required to be a "Marketplace of Ideas": Everyone has to have the opportunity to express their thoughts
 - University has the right to put reasonable limitations on when, where, and how speech can ensure campus safety and to make sure that activities are not interrupted
 - Cannot limit based on content of the speech
 - Non-KSU Individuals may only come on the campus by submitting a form and it must be approved by the Dean of Students
 - Not all speech is protected; for example, true threats and photos depicting unlawful activity are not
 - Hate speech is not illegal (it is protected speech)
 - Ways to respond: create counter-programming, speaking back, don't restrict the free speech of others, partner with other students through different activities, and/or disengage
 - Contact: legal.kennesaw.edu <u>Questions:</u>
 - Senator Thompson: Has there ever been an instance where

the University had to limit speech?

- Can't think of an instance at this moment; there has been a time where they had to go back and look at the form and take away objects/items (ex: amplifier) because the person did not get it approved first on the form
- President Johnson: Are the forms public knowledge?
 - Yes, you can make an open records request to the Dean of Students.
- Senator Valdez: Is there a limit on the requests? Can anyone request?
 - Anyone can request. There may be limits. Under Open Requests law, there might be a charge.
- Senator Branche: Best tactic to make them leave?
 - They are going to be here regardless. Best response is counter programming and disengaging.
- Attorney General Waits: Can we get notified if they reserve a space?
 - No, please ask instead. Legal team needs to make sure that they are engaging in contact neutral activity.
